- An alarming outbreak of mysterious **viral pneumonia** in central China has been linked to a 1,000-stall food market in Wuhan. The market, now quarantined for cleaning, sold seafood and wild animals like marmots, deer, and venomous snakes. While the virus can cause severe illness, it does not transmit readily between people, according to Chinese authorities.

- Three stomach drugs were recalled this week because of possible NDMA (carcinogen) contamination. - Researchers analyzing the National Health Interview Survey were surprised to find **higher than expected levels of drinking by cancer survivors**. Paradoxically, those with better self-reported health had higher levels of drinking. 16.7% of cancer survivors self-reported as smokers.

- **Keytruda** won U.S. FDA approval for a hard-to-treat form of bladder cancer, non-muscle invasive bladder cancer. More than 80,000 Americans were newly diagnosed with bladder cancer over the last year. Merck's Keytruda is already approved for other cancers including melanoma, lung, head and neck, and Hodgkin lymphoma.

- Some experts suggest that egg-based influenza vaccines are often less effective than egg-free types, since mutations can occur in the viruses as they grow in the embryo-containing eggs. The Department of Defense is conducting a large study comparing the effectiveness of the different vaccine types, with results expected within the next couple of years. - Finding genetic links to mental health disorders is the primary goal of the **Million Veteran Program**, a compilation of health and genetic data on 200,000 U.S. military veterans. Researchers at the program have identified six genetic variants that are linked to **anxiety**. - The U.S. cancer death rate fell 2.2 percent between 2016 and 2017, the largest single-year drop ever reported, according to the American Cancer Society. The improvement was largely due to gains against lung cancer. Melanoma had the largest mortality rate drop of any cancer, especially in adults 65 and older, but there was less progress against colon, breast, and prostate cancer. The overall cancer death rate has fallen 29% since 1991, the peak year for cancer deaths.

- CVS, Walgreen Co., Walmart, Rite Aid, and other **drugstore chains are suing doctors** in northeast Ohio, claiming that it is the prescription-writing physicians who bear responsibility for the opioid crisis, not the pharmacists. The drugstore chains, in addition to drug manufacturers and distributors, are being sued by local governments for their part in causing the opioid epidemic. When the governments' lawsuits were amended to target pharmacists for dispensing the drugs, the drugstores reacted with their own litigation against doctors. 
