News Highlights:

- Amneal, Teva (Activis), and Marksans Pharma Limited, India recalled some lots of **extended release metformin** because of detection of **NDMA (a carcinogen)**. Apotex expanded its recall from last week. <u>https://www.fda.gov/safety/recalls-market-withdrawals-safety-alerts</u>

- A Kobe University study provided insights about where sugar goes when it is removed from the blood by diabetes drug metformin. A new imaging apparatus, the "PET-MRI" allowed scientists to look at where sugar is accumulating in the bodies of patients taking metformin. They discovered that sugar is excreted into the intestines and into the stool. A similar imaging technology "FDG-PET" with CT is used to find hard-to-find cancers in the body, since cancers consume more sugar than normal tissue. Comparison images show the locations of sugar accumulation in the metformin-taking patients. https://www.sciencedaily.com/releases/2020/06/200603100503.htm

- The FDA approved expanding the use of AstraZeneca's **blood thinner drug Brilinta** for reducing the risk of a first heart attack or stroke in high-risk patients with coronary artery disease. Brilinta, approved in 2014, has a **boxed warning** for bleeding risk and for reduced effectiveness when used with more than 100mg of aspirin. Patients commonly take it when getting a stent placement.

Drug and Vaccine Production

- A bipartisan senate finance committee heard testimony on the **FDA's foreign drug manufacturing inspection process**. Because of the novel coronavirus pandemic, no foreign inspections of facilities are taking place, and more than 70% of the U.S. active pharmaceutical ingredients are made overseas. Concern about drug quality is also heightened because of **impurities** recently found in generics like valsartan, ranitidine, and metformin. Some panel experts called for more testing of drugs and more U.S.-based manufacturing.

- The Health and Human Services Department (HHS) contracted with several companies, including Richmond, Virginia startup <u>Phlow Corporation</u> and non-profit **Civica RX**, to cooperatively manufacture **essential generic drugs** at a new facility in Virginia.

- In response to Gavi's announcement, the non-profit **Doctors without Borders** issued a plea for government leaders to demand pharmaceutical corporations commit to selling any potential future COVID-19 vaccines **at cost**. "To date, governments and philanthropic organisations have given over **US\$4.4 billion to pharmaceutical corporations** for research and development for COVID-19 vaccines. However, by and large, **no conditions for access or affordability** have been included as a precondition to any of that funding." https://www.msf.org/any-future-covid-19-vaccines-must-be-sold-cost

- A whopping **2 billion doses of the novel coronavirus vaccine** being developed by Oxford University and AstraZeneca have now been pre-funded with collaboration partners including Britain, the United States, the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI), Gavi the Vaccine Alliance, as well as the Serum Institute of India.

COVID-19 Transmission

- A study by the Netherlands' National Institute for Health (RIVM) concluded that children under the age of 12 play little role in transmitting the new coronavirus; they suggest that transmission occurs primarily between adults and from adults to children.
