Health News

- More recalls were announced for **diabetes drug metformin**. Lupin Pharmaceuticals recalled all batches of 500mg and 1000mg Metformin Hydrochloride Extended-Release tablets. So far, a total of 75 extended-release product versions from five manufacturers are on the FDA recall list because of high levels of NDMA (a carcinogen). The FDA says that testing has not shown NDMA to be present in immediate release metformin products (the most commonly prescribed type of metformin).

- The **Dietary Guidelines Advisory Committee** released its report with recommendations that will be used as the basis for *2020-2025 Dietary Guidelines for America*. The guidelines will affect everything from school lunches to physicians' advice about nutrition. One of the key takeaways from the report is that Americans need to reduce their added sugar intake. The committee recommends **reducing average sugar consumption** from 13% of daily calories to just 6%; this is the equivalent of 30g for someone on a 2,000 calorie-a-day diet. Also, it advises that children should not have any sweetened drinks before the age of two.

- Robot jaws that mimic human jaws have been developed as a prototype "artificial oral environment" for testing the chewing gum method of drug delivery. A mechanical engineer and dental professor at University of Bristol tested their robot by assessing the amount of xylitol released from chewing gum via artificial saliva solutions collected after various intervals of continuous chewing.

Concerns about Covid-19 Case Data:

- India added a record number of coronavirus cases in a 24 hour period, almost 35,000, bringing them over the one million mark for the first time. The country has the **third-highest case load in the world**, after the U.S. and Brazil. However, it has an unusually low death rate (14 per million vs. 392 per million in the U.S.). Experts say that because many deaths go unreported in India, its coronavirus death rates are probably higher than what is reported.

- In the U.K., **release of death counts has been temporarily halted** because of concerns that Public Health England has been '**over-exaggerating**' fatalities by counting people as victims **if they die of any cause at any time after testing positive** for the virus. Reported deaths per million in the UK: 651, the second highest in the world, after **Belgium**. (see BBC link above for chart).

- It is difficult to compare coronavirus case and death data for different countries when each country has different reporting criteria. For example, in **Belgium**, which has an **843 per million death rate**, experts say that over 50% of deaths in Belgium "are deaths that have not been confirmed by diagnostic tests. These are possible cases but have been reported as Covid-19 related deaths."

2020-2021 Flu Season: Flu Prevention During the COVID-19 Pandemic

Because of COVID-19, this year's flu season brings with it heightened patient concerns about contracting the flu. Understandably, hospitals are also concerned as they want to avoid having to treat an influx of patients sick with seasonal flu during the middle of the coronavirus pandemic. To minimize chances of influenza outbreak, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) encourages everyone over the age of six months to get a flu shot this season.

This year, as in previous years, the CDC recommends that people get their flu shots **starting in September**. While patients may be anxious to get their vaccine right away, an early vaccine might not be effective for the duration of the flu season, which usually lasts from late fall until early spring. The CDC has recommended procedures for **safely administering vaccines** in various settings. They have also recommended that those with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 wait to receive their flu shot.

Demand for flu vaccines this year is expected to exceed last year's supply levels, so manufacturers have pledged to boost production by 10%, for a total of at least **189 million doses this season in the U.S.** Vaccine maker Sanofi told *the Guardian* that it will increase global production by 20%, but that "global demand will outpace supply. All these additional requests that have come in context of covid are beyond our anticipated and planned supply." Over the past four flu seasons, the U.S. has seen a steady increase in vaccination rates. During 2019-2020, about 174.5 million flu vaccines were given, about a 3 percent increase over the previous year.

What's different for the 2020-2021 flu season?

With one exception, all flu shots administered this season, including **Fluad Quadrivalent** and **Fluzone High Dose** for seniors age 65 and up, will be "**quadrivalent**," meaning they will contain four influenza virus strains. One trivalent (three virus strains) version of **Fluad** for seniors will also be available.

The CDC does not recommend one of these stronger vaccines for seniors over the other. A Duke University (along with CDC, Boston Medical Center, and Cincinnati Children's Medical Center) <u>clinical trial</u> compared the side effects of **Fluzone High Dose** with **Fluad**, and preliminary tables of results suggest that Fluad had lower incidence of side effects, but the quality control review of the study has not yet been completed. Both Fluzone High Dose and Fluad tend to have more side effects than standard-dose flu vaccines.
